As a general guide, proposals should include: the title of the volume, a list of editors and their contact details, a brief description of the volume's scope, content, and target audience, and a list of proposed chapter titles and their authors. Special publications general require a minimum of 20 chapters.

All proposals are vetted for their suitability by the Special Publication Editors prior to being submitted to the IAS Bureau for approval.

Submission

Chapter submissions to new Special Publications (after approval by the IAS Bureau) can now be made to the dedicated website at Manuscript Central:

This site enables complete electronic handling of the individual chapters in new volumes. Please make sure you are aware of the assigned Special Publication number before submitting a manuscript.

IAS Special Publications are produced to the same editorial standards and follow the same format as the journal *Sedimentology*.
